**FINANCIALS** - Savings \$25,754.81. Checking \$1,344.73. July 4th Costs exceeded our budget slightly because of the cost of the signage. For questions/concerns about parade expenses please contact Barbara. We will receive funds from the town of Brighton shortly.

**UPD REPORT** - Anna Walker reported that in the month of July, the Big Cottonwood Canyon had 205 calls for service. Most notably there were 13 reports of reckless drivers or road rage, 11 traffic accidents, four reported incidents of domestic violence, and one DUI investigation. There was one fall which resulted in a death, three incidents which called for Search and Rescue, 18 incidents of a suspicious person or vehicle, and 30 citizen or motorist assists. There were two reports of trespassers, 10 watershed or animal complaints, seven burglarized vehicles, and one burglarized cabin.

The relationship between the UPD [Unified Police Department] and the Sheriff's Office is one of cohesiveness here in Big Cottonwood Canyon. We work together and supplement the other, when needed, with the purpose of serving the community.

## UPD Update

Carolyn Keigley read from the UPD minutes about an incident in Big Cottonwood Canyon. She reported on several situations where officers collaborated to protect the public and assist in life-

threatening emergencies. The community is grateful for the lives saved thanks to the dedicated efforts of these officers.

## • Town of Brighton Update

The Neighborhood Nodes meeting at the fire station was a success! During the open house, we reviewed all the ideas proposed by the Arcadis Consulting Company for future projects in our town. The "What Ifs" presented were very exciting. Stay tuned for the link to learn more about the event. Many great ideas were shared, and they will require some forward-thinking planning. Barbara will be sending out a copy of the report as soon as possible.

# • Chipper Days Update

Barbara reported that the Chipper Days Crew is doing a great job. Some fuel reduction work has been completed. The crew has been called out for fires, but are back to work on Chipping. The crew is working hard to complete the remaining jobs. They have done some great work in Spruces already on fuel reduction. This year we have 99 families and over 1560 hours completed already.

## Resort Updates

Solitude - Nick Sieckowski reported that Solitude just had their homeowner's weekend. They finished up their HOA meeting and receptions. It was a very nice time in the Village. They have been open 7 days a week for scenic hiking, disk golf and mountain biking. Check out the website for details of all the events at Solitude. Brighton- John Knoblock reported two mountain bike trails will be completed soon and the trail is in great shape. Two new bridges are going in on Great Western. Monday night is a free movie night at Alpine Rose. Check out the website for more events and details.
